


Dear UConn Stamford BCLC,

As a member of the Stamford Business Connections Learning Community (BCLC) there are certain requirements that must be met at the end of every term during your two year enrollment in this program. If these requirements are not met at a satisfactory level; students will not be permitted to continue in the BCLC program.

- A student's BCLC UNIV course grade.
- Involvement in BCLC sponsored events
- Engagement in BCLC committees, as well as BCLC committee events will be part of this review.

Further details please be sure to review the breakdown of each component below.

UNIV Courses: Sixty percent of this review is based on a student's success in the BCLC UNIV course each term.

- If a student achieves a final grade of 'B' or higher this would warrant the full sixty percent being awarded.
- Any final grades earned in this same course that fall between 'B-' through 'D-' would be award thirty percent.
- A final grade of an 'F' would receive zero percent.

Engagement in BCLC Events: Twenty percent of this review is based on a student's involvement in BCLC sponsored events outside of class. This would include events like BCLC Lunch N' Learns, BCLC Alumni presentations, BCLC Field Trips, etc. All events can be found on the BCLC google calendar for reference and planning purposes. Attendance is tracked at each event to ensure accurate student involvement.

- To achieve the full twenty percent a student would need to attend three to five events in total per term.
- Ten percent would be awarded if a student attended one to two events.
- Zero percent would be given should the student attend none.

Engagement in BCLC Committee Meetings: The last twenty percent of this review is based on a student's engagement in the BCLC committee meetings and events.

- Satisfactory attendance at a student's assigned committee meetings, which will be recorded by the committee Chair person, will count for ten percent of this total score.
- The other ten percent will be awarded in full if a student attends three to five BCLC committee events (separate from BCLC sponsored events).
 - Should a student only attend one to two BCLC committee events they will be given five percent.

If none are attended they will earn zero percent.

A BCLC student should aim to always achieve a full one hundred percent every term. As a program, the BCLC will automatically renew a student who achieved seventy-five percent or higher from this scale. However, if any BCLC students earn anywhere from sixty-five to seventy-five percent in total at the end of a term they will need to take additional actions to be continued into the following term. If students aim to achieve the award of BCLC scholar, all four terms (within a student's first two years at UConn) must be completed successfully along with the following: Bloomberg Certificate, two case competitions, attendance at the BCLC conference, and strong involvement in the BCLC sponsored events.

However, if any BCLC students earn anywhere from sixty-five to seventy-five percent in total at the end of a term they will need to take additional actions to be continued into the following term. If students aim to achieve the award of BCLC scholar, all four terms (within a student's first two years at UConn) must be completed successfully along with the following: Bloomberg Certificate, two case competitions, attendance at the BCLC conference, and strong involvement in the BCLC sponsored events.

The Stamford BCLC program reserves the right to not renew students outside of this rubric above as well for reasons like if there are conduct issues or a student is no longer a Stamford Business major as examples. If there are any questions or concerns about one's status in the Stamford BCLC program, we encourage students to contact BCLCStamford@uconn.edu.

- Students who achieve 75% or higher get automatically continued in the BCLC at Stamford for the next term, through the end of their second year.
- Students who achieve 65%-74%, will be asked if they wish to continue and are required to meet with a staff member to review the goals of the community before they are continued.
- Students who are below 65% will not be permitted to continue as a BCLC member.

BCLC Scholar

To be eligible to become a BCLC Stamford Scholar, each BCLC Stamford student must complete the following requirements over two years in the BCLC Stamford program:

- 1. Complete the four required BCLC Stamford 1-credit courses:
 - UNIV 1810*—BCLC First Year Experience (fall semester freshman year)
 - UNIV 1810—BCLC Contemporary Issues in the World of Business (spring semester freshman year)
 - UNIV 3820—BCLC Mentorship Course (fall semester sophomore year)
 - BUSN 3005*—Career Development in Business (spring semester year)
- 2. Become Bloomberg Market Concepts certified.
- 3. Participate in at least two BCLC case competitions (one each year).
 - A BCLC case competition is offered once per semester and on our BCLC International Business Immersion Experience in May to strengthen our students' teamwork, business analysis & strategic thinking skills.
- 4. Attend at least two BCLC Stamford Professional Development Conferences (one each year).
 - A BCLC Stamford Professional Development Conference is held once each semester to offer our students unique opportunities to learn new business skills and network with visiting alumni.
- 5. Attend two BCLC Stamford Lunch & Learn programs each year.
 - BCLC Stamford Lunch & Learns are special opportunities for our students to engage with a UConn alum in business in their desired field. These may be in-person or online engagement opportunities in the BCLC or the School of Business.


BCLC Stamford Scholars are recognized upon graduation with a BCLC cord and special notation in the Commencement program.



BCLC 2022 International Business Immersion Experience




