### **SAMPLE SEQUENCE** FOR FIRST TWO YEARS

This includes some space for 3000-level Business courses that are open to Business students with sophomore standing (see page 2). Note that these courses are not necessarily required to be taken in the sophomore year to stay on track. Some 3000-level Business courses have multiple criticals as prerequisites, so if a student plans to take them in sophomore year, it will likely require an adjustment to the critical sequencing. Decisions to include these courses in a student's sophomore year should be made in consultation with an Academic Advisor.

BUSN 3005 is generally offered Fall and Spring terms and required for all non-Accounting majors. Required Elective Courses: A degree in business requires a minimum of 120 credits, including electives. At least 60 of the 120 credits must be from nonbusiness subjects (gen-eds are included in the 60 non-business calculation). The typical Business student needs approximately 30 elective credits, and electives should be distributed throughout all terms. Scholastic Standing Requirement: All students in the School of Business are held to Scholastic Standing Requirements as written in the Undergraduate Catalog, which outlines cumulative, term, and Business GPA requirements and requires all critical courses to be complete by the end of the student's fourth term.
