*Residence Requirement: At least 50% of the business credit hours required for the business degree must be earned while a student at the University of Connecticut. At least 24 credits in 3000/4000 level courses including MENT 4902 and BUSN 3003W must be earned at the University of Connecticut, including no more than three independent study credits and three field study internship credits. Education Abroad courses may not be used to meet this requirement.

Students in UConn Honors Program: Must take BUSN 4897W or FNCE 4997W in Senior year.

GPA Rule for Graduation: A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA in all major courses, all Business courses, and all graded courses is required for graduation. See catalog for details.
